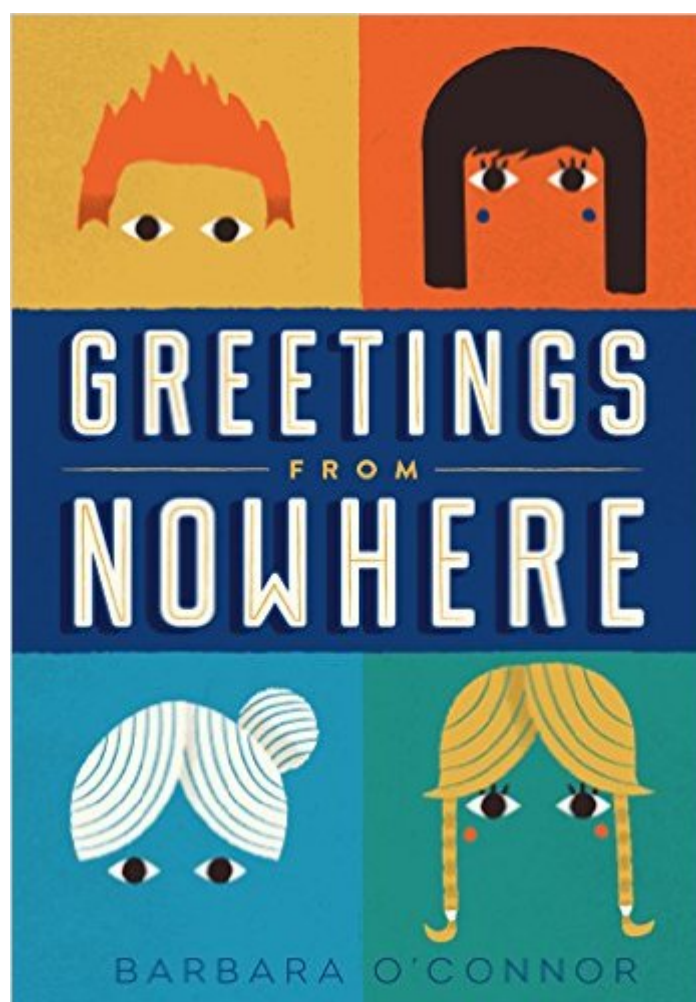

From an author long recognized for her true Southern voice and heartfelt characters, *Greetings from Nowhere*, with its four intertwining stories, brings Barbara O'Connor's work to a new level of sophistication. Amazing story with so many characters woven together to create a wonderful storyline. Although the characters were different ages all of them taught each other an important life lesson. I read it in one day and couldn't put it down! Tremendous read-suggested for read aloud in an intermediate classroom or even book clubs. It will lead to excellent conversations.

In *Greetings from Nowhere* by Barbara O'Connor, widow Agnes Duncan is going to have to sell the Sleepy Time Motel that she and her husband Harold used to run. Guests are not coming, and the place is falling apart. But just as she's about to sign the papers, three families arrive, each with a troubled child. Loretta's biological mom has died and left her with a charm bracelet showing all the places she might have gone. Now Loretta's adoptive parents are taking her on a journey to discover those places. Kirby's mom is taking him to a military-style school, but her car died and she ran out of money before she got there. Meanwhile, Willow's mom Dorothy has left her and her father, Clyde, and her dad wants to start a new life by buying the old motel. This is a light and beautiful tale, filled with love and perfect details that make a person feel good.

O'Connor has crafted what may be her most heartfelt and engaging story yet, with a memorable cast of characters who spend a few lifechanging days together at the Sleepy Time Motel in the Smoky Mountains. Short chapters with alternating points of view blend into a smoothly woven text that reveals just the right amount of backstory to expose the dreams and difficulties which have led the assorted travelers to their common destination. A great classroom readaloud or gift book that invites readers of all ages to "sit and ponder" the mysteries of friendship between generations.

*Greetings from Nowhere* is about four main characters, five if you count the motel, which I would. Every character has his or her own story, and, of course, the stories will overlap during the course of the book. There is something so very sweet about Barbara O'Connor's characters. On the surface, they seem simple, lacking complexity and perhaps even facile, but that is only because she does not write down every word of their stories. She leaves it to the readers to fill in the framework of the characters' story, and, so, no two people will ever read this book the same way. In a way, the reader becomes part of the book. If the reader chooses to skim this book, the characters may never take on life beyond these two hundred or so pages. If the reader, instead, tries to relate to the characters, tries to see the world from the characters' point of view, then the characters will gain depth and complexity and even immortality. It doesn't take me long to read a Barbara O'Connor -- three or four hours, maybe -- but her characters will stay with me for a very long time. A writer with a light touch should not be mistaken for a light-weight writer.

When you read more than one of an author's books, there is the natural tendency to compare them and ask yourself which one is your favorite. In the case of Barbara

O'Connor's works, that's an almost impossible question to answer. First, let me say if you don't go out and get *Wish* as soon as it hits the stores this week, you are going to miss out on all the fun and excitement that's exploding in the book world from this, her newest. Then, after falling in love with *Wish*, if you haven't read her others, like *How to Steal a Dog*, *The Small Adventure of Popeye and Elvis*, or one of the fourteen others, get going. Most of all, do not miss *Greetings from Nowhere* where a heartfelt experience unfolds at a down on its heels motel in the Great Smokey Mountains. In addition to being everything you want from a middle grade book, the craftsmanship here is extraordinary. This book is a study in how to write multiple fraught points of view and bring them together in a memorable and gratifying ending.

The Sleepy Time Motel has seen better days. Days when guests actually showed up and enjoyed the free coffee, the complimentary maps. But Aggie's beloved Harold died and the last visitors signed the motel register nearly three months ago. So even though it's breaking Aggie's heart, she's put her Shawnee Gap, North Carolina motel, in the heart of the Smoky Mountains, up for sale. Barbara O'Connor takes three kids with little in common but the fate that put them at the Sleepy Time together, mixes them with Aggie and her cat named Ugly, and delivers a story for middle grade readers that sparkles. Young fans of her many award-winning books will find *Greetings from Nowhere* endearing, poignant, and even funny. By the end of this story, readers will come to realize that everyone has something worth paying attention to if you dig deep enough. And what started out as "nowhere"? That little motel in the heart of the Smokey Mountains turns into one terrific vacation spot. Just loved this novel. A must read!
