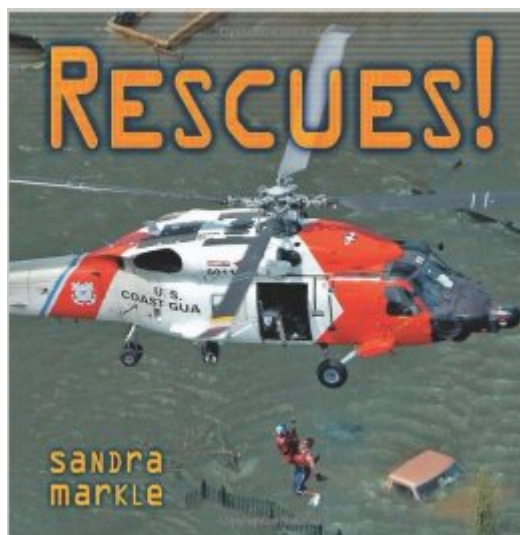

Our grandson was 3 or 4 when we first checked this book out of the library. We adults were a bit taken aback by the grimness of such stories as that of the frozen baby and the sailor trapped beneath his boat. But our grandson took it all in stride. When a mining accident was in the news again recently, he told me he wanted this book again, so I bought it for him. The story of the nine trapped miners who were rescued in about five days is dramatic and hopeful. You can select which parts of each story you read, skipping the more technical explanations with your 3-year-old. Now that Jack is 5, we read it all. The book also includes 9-11, but focuses on the rescue robots. I found

it a good way to introduce that horrible subject to Jack. In general, the emphasis is on rescue and medical aid to the victims, so it isn't disturbing, despite the terrible situations. Jack and I have always favored the nonfiction section of our library. Fights the tendency to underestimate what children can learn and understand.
