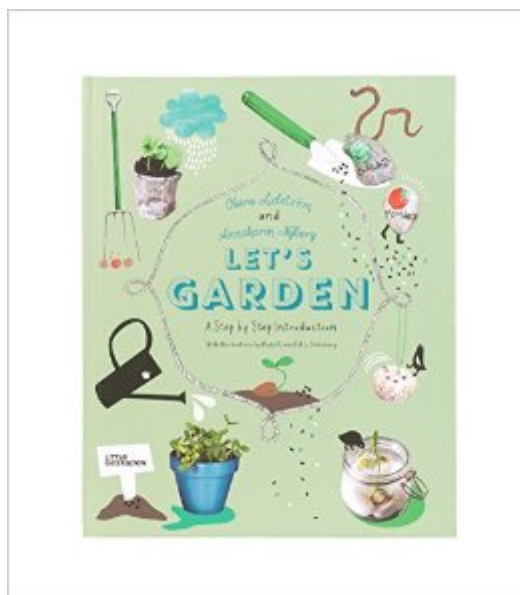

With 48 pages of step-by-step instructions and colorful illustrations, the book compares in price to other similar about gardening written for children. The medium-sized book measures 7.8 by 0.3 by 9.7 inches. I would definitely pay the current price, which I rate very positively. Recommended for readers between the ages of 7 and 10 in second through fifth grade, *Let's Garden: A Step by Step Introduction* is a DIY
