

There are sections on religion as well as on the oceans and both the Arctic and Antarctic regions.I highly recommend this book.

I got this book to aid me in learning the countries of the world. This is perfect for that. The book is divided into continents, then regions, then countries. Each continent and region has a preface talking about major things in that area and cultures. What interests me most, is the information about individual countries. Each country has a picture of it within a zoomed in map, so you get an idea of the shape of the country. It has a quick facts section, that talks about size, population, religions, education, doctors, and how many TVs per-person (one way to gauge wealth). Then it has the main part for the country, where it talks a little about the culture, people, interesting facts, and sometimes

a little history background. This works for me in learning countries, it is also going to be helpful when I hear of a country and want to know a little more about it. Also, it has lots of pictures and great page quality.

I bought the hardcover version of this book as a gift for a teenager. After I thumbed through it, I bought the paperback version for myself. Why? Because its format, with maps, pictures, and easy readability, makes it interesting to pick up and look through, and a closed book is just a piece of wood. This makes a good "coffee table" book. It doesn't require reading all the way through to be interesting. On the other hand, it does have its drawbacks. Most countries are covered on one page, or one-half page, or only one-third of a page. With a large part of that taken up by those maps and pictures, the coverage is of necessity cursory. For example, it doesn't even mention that Mexico has states. (The full proper name is "Los Estados Unidos de Mexico" - "The United States of Mexico"). That is a fact that I learned only when I visited and toured three of the states. If you want in-depth information on a country, you must look elsewhere. And, as some have mentioned, some of the information is outdated, stereotyped, or of questionable relevance and importance. That is not to diminish the value of this book, though. There is a lot to be learned from it, and it provides a good general view of the world. Sometimes there is a great value in simplicity. Anyone who knew everything in this book would certainly be geography-savvy, and would know far more about the world than 99+% of the population.
